The installation of a MH requires a 5'L x 5'W area, cleanouts a 3'L x 3'W area, and approximately 10'L x 3'W area from the ground surface to the existing pipeline for external point repairs. Internal and/or external point repairs may occur in portions of the pipe that require repair due to offset joints, sags, intruding laterals, et etera.
