The project site is 7.56 acres and includes 5.33 acres for the development of up to a 21,000 sf library (19,500 sf net usable space) and will include a total of 98 parking spaces, of which 70 will be dedicated to the library and the remainder will be available to support future development. The remaining area would be graded for future development of the Ramona Intergenerational Community Campus (RICC). There are no approved designs for the RICC at this time, and construction of the RICC is not proposed as part of the project. The trail would be an ~1.7 mile long and 10 ft wide AC path, with landscaping, irrigation, and fencing (along portions). The trail would be constructed behind existing/new roadway curb/gutter. Notable infrastructure improvements are: Collins Ave. undercrossing; new pavement, curbs/gutters and driveways, and widening the Hewes St. pavement; a new box-culvert and headwall within Alameda Channel; and an interim gravel trail staging area for ~10 parking spaces. The Project would involve a total disturbance area of ~12.51 acres during construction and a total permanent impact area of ~6.46 acres at completion. The trail improvements would require localized excavation to depths ranging from ~1.5 ft for the typical trail segment to 20 ft for the undercrossing. Approx 1,300 cy of soil would be imported and 12,750 cy would be exported. The ~9 month construction period includes ~3 months beginning in Spring 2010 for the Hewes St. Segment, 2 months beginning in Winter 2010 for the Villa Park Rd/Santiago Canyon Rd/Cannon St Segment, and 4 months beginning in Summer 2011 for the Collins Ave. Segment. Construction of the undercrossing would require closure of all traffic lanes along the Collins Ave. Segment for up to 120 days. A southbound to westbound free right-turn lane at the intersection of Villa Park Rs. Santiago Canyon Rd and Cannon St., which was also a part of the Cannon Street Roadway Widening project evaluated under MND ENV 1776-05, would be constructed concurrently with the proposed bike trail Project.	<b>MND</b>	08/17/2009

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2009071064	<p>Valley Sand and Soil Santa Barbara County --Santa Barbara</p> <p>The project would allow the existing very small scale surface mining use to continue in a manner that ensures that interim and final slopes are stable and that re-vegetation is successful. The mine area is not visible from public viewing places or from other properties. The mining and reclamation plan was designed specifically to ensure that this continues to be the case, and engineered line of sight studies have been prepared. Under the proposed plan, ~200,000 cy of remaining white sand can be extracted over time, temporarily stockpiled onsite and delivered to consumers. Once the marketable material is extracted and stockpiled, all slopes will be finished at a maximum slope of 2:1 or flatter between 10 ft wide benches, with an overall global slope angle of about 3:1 (horizontal to vertical). The proposed removal action is Enhanced Bioremediation with Monitored Natural Attenuation for the groundwater at the Site. A former solvent washing operations impacted the Site's groundwater to approximately 500' laterally from the source area. Groundwater was encountered at approximately 50' below ground surface beneath the Site during the Site investigations. Based on the human health screening, the Site soil meets unrestricted land use standards. However, the risk calculations indicated consumption and exposures to groundwater would pose a significant threat to human health. 2009078119	Lake Perris Ramp 5 Replacement and Extension - Amended from May 2008 Boating and Waterways, Department of --Riverside The project will replace the nearly 40 year old concrete boat ramp with a new concrete ramp that meets current Cal Boating guidelines. The replacement ramp will be in the same footprint as the existing ramp. Due to an even lower lake level, the ramp will also be extended 30' to ensure it reaches the water. The California Natural Diversity Database and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife website has been researched and no threatened or endangered species will be affected by these projects. During the original ramp construction, this area, including the extension area was disturbed and fill placed. Any cultural resources are buried deeper than what minor grading will be required for this project. The area has been previously disturbed and the Eastern Information Center was queried regarding an adjacent project (ramp 6). 2009078120	Castaic Lake East Ramp Boarding Float Boating and Waterways, Department of --Los Angeles This project would replace the three existing boarding floats. The existing floats are damaged and need replacement. The only disturbance is replacement of the anchor system to attach the floats to. The East Ramp boating area consists of an asphalt launch ramp, parking lot, day-use area and restroom facilities.
