The project is an infill project that includes up to 150 residential units on a 2.3-acre site currently occupied by commercial uses. The project includes a four-story structure with one- and two-bedroom units, a leasing office, a

community/recreation space, underground parking garage, and outdoor spaces including a pool, patio areas, and landscaping. The main vehicular access to the project would be from East El Camino Real, and the facility would provide a total of 228 parking spaces (225 underground, three surface). Construction activities would include demolition of the existing single-story commercial structures and parking lots, as well as removal of trees and vegetation that would be replaced in

accordance with the project's landscape plan.

The proposed project involves modifying the existing Varner Road/Jefferson Street intersection, including widening Varner Road approximately 1,830 feet east and 675 feet west of Jefferson Street from two to four lanes of travel, as well as widening Jefferson Street north of its intersection at Varner Road from four to six lanes to approximately Sun City Boulevard. I-10/Jefferson Street interchange.

Shasta River Riparian Protection & Enhancement Project

This project consists of activities designed to protect and enhance riparian vegetation at six separate ranches. Project actions are designed to directly improve riparian vegetation along the Shasta River thereby increasing shade and bank stability which results in decreased sedimentation and decreased water temperatures. The components of this project are designed to improve water quality by increasing vegetation, thereby decreasing water temperatures and increasing dissolved oxygen (DO) in the Shasta River, an anadromous fishery, and known spawning and rearing habitat for the federally threatened coho salmon. The project addresses numerous regional and regulatory priorities and provides benefits to water quality, and improvements to aquatic and riparian habitat along the Shasta River and its tributaries. The Shasta Valley Resource Conservation District (RCD) has received a Clean Water Act 319h-Nonpoint Source Implementation grant (Agreement # 11-099-551) from the State Water Resources Control Board, for planning and implementation of the proposed project.

The Twin Cities Road Widening is located along Twin Cities Road from east of Fermoy Way to Bergeron Road, along the northern boundary of the City of Galt. The project consists of adding a westbound lane on Twin Cities Road, along the aforementioned segment for the purpose of matching the existing number of eastbound lanes, as well as to modify the Twin Cities/Fermoy Way intersection, approaches, and transition as required by appropriate design standards. The total area to be disturbed, which includes new pavement, stormwater drainage improvements, and reconstructed driveways, would be approximately 1.54 acres. Existing paved areas would be overlaid and/or restriped.
