

## **Measuring State Progress on Planning for the Impacts of Climate Change: State Sustainability Roadmaps**

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### **Background**

One measure of State progress on adaptation is the implementation of Executive Order B-30-15, which requires state agencies to consider climate change impacts in all planning and investment decisions. Guidance<sup>1</sup> on implementing this executive order at state agencies was issued in 2017. State agencies were then asked to report their progress and plans for implementing this guidance in their 2018/2019 Sustainability Roadmaps. Sustainability Roadmaps are completed by state agencies and departments every two years to report progress and clarify plans for implementing EO B-18-12 and the Green Building Action Plan. They follow templates developed by the Government Operations Agency. It is important to note that the Roadmaps are completed by departments and agencies *that own facilities*, meaning that not every state department submits a biennial roadmap.

### **Evaluation Status**

Staff have compiled results from ten Final Sustainability Roadmap Climate Adaptation chapters that have been submitted thus far. Thirteen remaining roadmaps are expected to be submitted to the Government Operations Agency by May 2018, and will be included in the final baseline report. Figures 1 and 2 represent select data from a preliminary analysis of summarized results, and are meant to provide a snapshot of how departments are addressing climate impacts. A more in depth analysis will be conducted using the framework discussed during the April 2 Technical Advisory Council meeting.

The following departments are included in the summarized data in Figures 1 and 2:

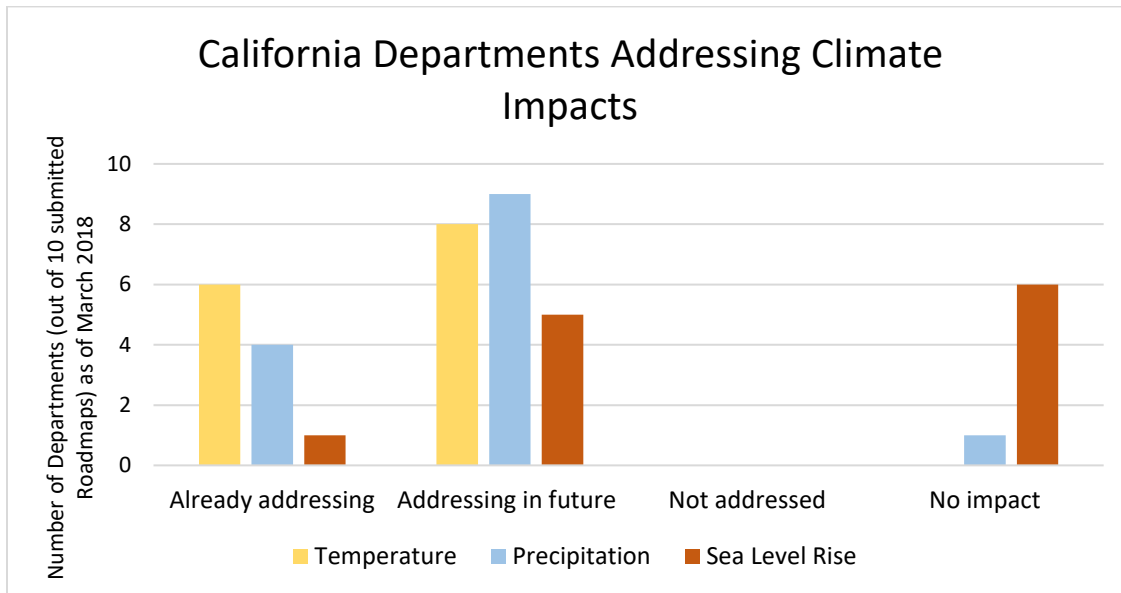
