Final review draft APG | January – March 2020

- Reviewed literature and key adaptation planning resources
- Prepared data compilation and initial assessment memo
- Developed preliminary recommendations memo
- Conducted phone interviews with a sample group of local government staff

Draft Recommendations

Goals of APG 2.0

- Conduct local adaptation planning using best science and practices
- Provide guidance on alignment and integration with other local and state adaptation planning efforts
- Show how to meet applicable regulations
- Prepare document in plain, user-friendly language
- Anticipate integration into the Adaptation Clearinghouse

Users

- Primary
 - Local governments, tribal governments, regional planning agencies
 - Planners, emergency managers, public work staff, public health workers, and water management agencies
- Secondary
 - State agencies, private sector practitioners, community-based organizations, academic institutions, quasi-governmental organizations

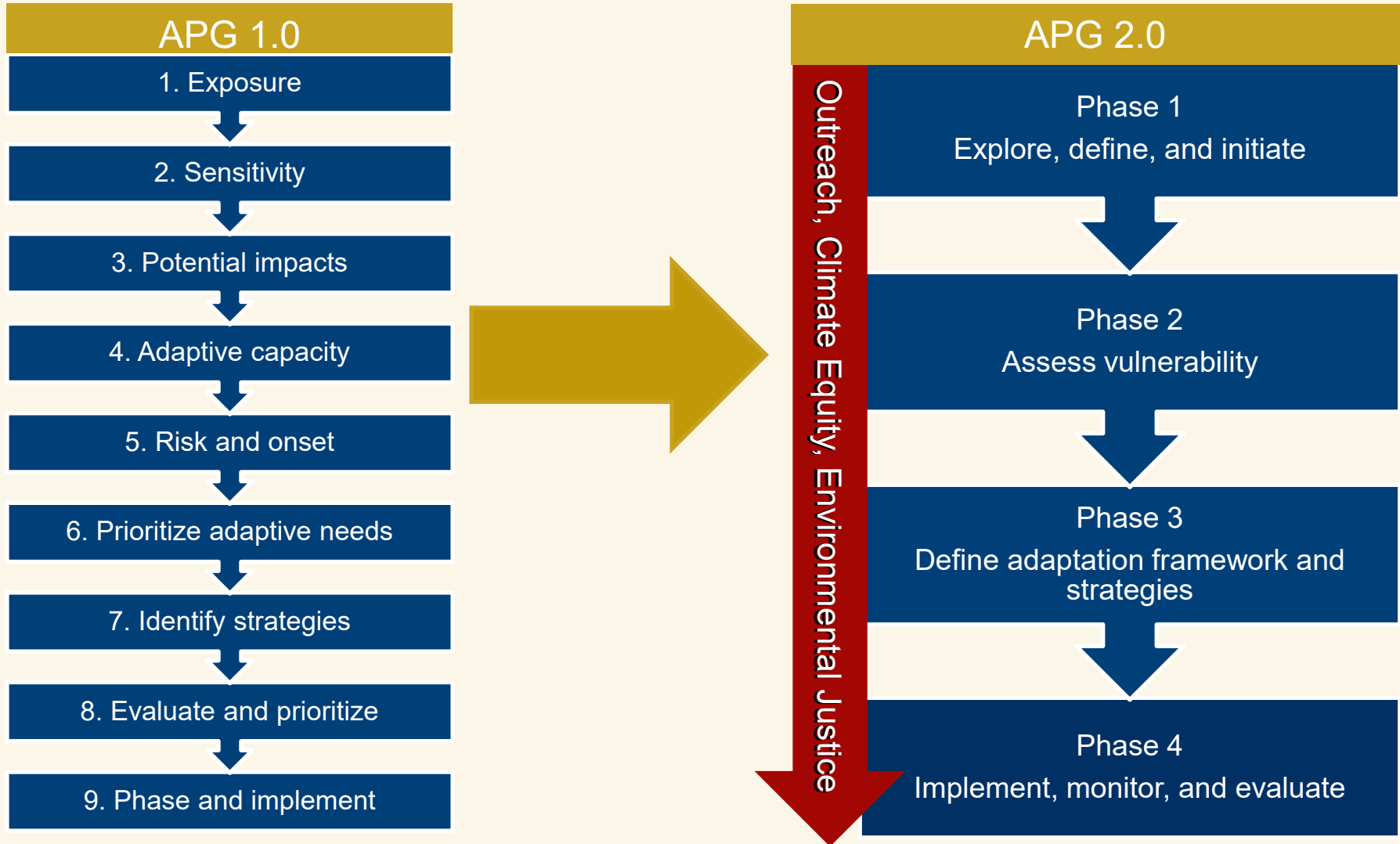
Guidance

- Provide “how to use APG 2.0” guidance based on users desired outcomes
 - Regulatory consistency (Government Code 65302)
 - Plan Alignment
- Provide guidance sensitive to resource availability
 - Present a tiered approach to adaptation planning
 - Provide a “minimum” and “enhanced” approach throughout guidance (as applicable)
- Leverage and integrate: Cal-Adapt, Safeguarding California, Fourth Assessment, State Hazard Mitigation Plan, and Adaptation Clearinghouse
